

RUSHVILLE CITY COMMON COUNCIL
TUESDAY, MARCH 20, 2001
6:00 P.M.

The Rushville City Common Council met on the above date and time at 270 West 15th Street, Rushville, Indiana. In the absence of Mayor Bridges, Mayor Pro-Tem Pavey called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with Bill Goins, Darrin McGowan, Brian Sheehan, and John Byrne answering roll call. Councilman Goins was not present. Also present were City Attorney, Paul Barada, Jr., Jan Voiles, *Rushville Republican*, and Scott Murray, WKWH.

MINUTES * * *

Minutes of the March 6, 2001 meeting were presented for approval. Byrne made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT * * *

Mayor Pro-Tem Pavey gave the following reports:

- There will be a meeting of the City Council, Utility Board, and representatives from the town of Mays on Wednesday, March 21, at 6:30. The meeting will be held at the Council Chambers. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the possibility of piping Mays sewage to Rushville for disposal purposes.
- Thursday, March 22, is the date for the Mayor's Roundtable in Rushville. The meal will be served at 12:00 with a program to follow.
- Thursday, March 22 the Community Center Task Force chairmen and assistant chairmen will meet to discuss which direction the Task Force should take.
- Wednesday, March 28 at 7:00 P.M. there will be a meeting of the Emergency Management Advisory Council. The meeting will be held at the Courthouse assembly room. The program will consist of a tabletop exercise in school safety and an emergency program on school shootings.

CLERK-TREASURER'S REPORT * * *

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS * * *

Park – Parks Director Mathews announced that the Board of Works had approved the hiring of Debbie Alspaugh for pool manager and Chuck McMichael as assistant pool manager.

Fire – Fire Chief Clark informed the Board that the City Fire Department will be giving mutual aid to the town of Glenwood while they are having a bridge replaced beginning March 26 for a period of 30 days.

OLD BUSINESS * * *

Ordinance 2001-2 – Amendment to Subdivision Ordinance – Sheehan made a motion to approve Ordinance 2001-2. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Ordinance 2001-3 – Amendment to Zoning Ordinance (Flood Hazard) – Sheehan made a motion to approve Ordinance 2001-3. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Presentation on Bonds from Crowe Chizek – Mike Harmless gave a presentation for Crowe Chizek to refinance the Utility bonds.

Fire Truck Bids – Fire Chief Clark gave his recommendation to purchase the commercial chassis with the specs on the body that he had presented. Sheehan made a motion to approve alternate bid #3 with the payment plan "A" from Public Finance. Byrne seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Discussion on Insurance – Ron Bluel, general agent for Schroeder Insurance Company, explained some of the differences on the insurance plans and premiums between American National and Clarendon National. The prescription card with Clarendon is higher with rates for generic at \$10.00, formulary drugs are \$20.00, and name brand is \$40.00. After further discussion Sheehan made a motion to go with Clarendon effective March 1, 2001 on a temporary basis, but

to continue to look for a plan that may be cheaper. RFP's have been requested and are due in by April 1. Byrne seconded the motion. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS * * *

Gas Bids – There were 3 gas bids received. They were as follows:

- Ag One Co-Op, Inc. = 87 octane .969, diesel .943
- Professional Fleet Services (Herdrich) = 87 octane 1.017, diesel 1.145
- Fuelman of Indiana = 87 octane .9515, diesel .9080

After lengthy discussion, Sheehan made a motion to table for further review. McGowan seconded. Motion carried.

Police Car Bids – One bid was received on the sale of the police car. The bid was from Grace Quality Used Cars for \$5,555.00. Sheehan made a motion to reject the bid. Byrne seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Claims – Byrne made a motion to approve the claims as presented. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before Council, McGowan made a motion to adjourn. Byrne seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
