

RUSHVILLE CITY COMMON COUNCIL
TUESDAY, MAY 1, 2001
6:00 P.M.

The Rushville City Common Council met on the above date and time at 270 West 15th Street, Rushville, Indiana. Mayor Bridges called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. with Bill Goins, Darrin McGowan, John Byrne, and Mike Pavey answering roll call. Councilman Sheehan was not present. Also present were City Attorney, Paul Barada, Jr., and Jan Voiles, *Rushville Republican*.

MINUTES * * *

Minutes of the April 17, 2001 meeting were presented for approval. Byrne made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT * * *

Mayor Bridges reported the following:

- Bridges met with the Ameitech people and they believed that the contaminates should be removed from the soil by next week. The asbestos and flammable materials have been removed from the inside of the building. Spoke with IDEM and stated that they are comfortable with the remediation program.
- Had a meeting on Saturday concerning the map revision and believed it went well.
- Attended a meeting of the NAACP with Councilman Goins. Councilman Goins thanked the Mayor for his interest and attendance.

CLERK-TREASURER'S REPORT * * *

Copley asked Council to act on Resolution 2001-12, a Resolution approving abatement for the Trane Company, which was inadvertently overlooked in November when tax abatement was approved for the Trane Company. Byrne made a motion to approve Resolution 2001-12. Goins seconded the motion. Motion carried.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS * * *

Fire – Assistant Chief Shelton reported that the ladder truck had been repaired and was in good working condition.

CITIZEN'S CONCERNS * * *

Mayor Bridges asked if anyone objected to a change in order of the agenda. The request was to discuss new business first and then old business. There being no objections the meeting continued with new business.

NEW BUSINESS * * *

Intat Statement of Benefits – Donald Schnell was present to ask for approval for the Statement of Benefits for Intat. Goins made a motion to approve the Statement of Benefits. Pavey seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Ara Presentation – Eric Frye, Trena Carter, and Jennifer Ruzicka gave a presentation to Council. Trena spoke on the overview of the organization; Jennifer explained the services provided by Ara; Eric explained the needs assessment and planning steps.

Resolution 2001-10 – Byrne made a motion to approve Resolution 2001-10, transferring monies from electric liquidation interest to the general fund. Goins seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Resolution 2001-11 – Byrne made a motion to approve Resolution 2001-11, reimbursing monies back to an appropriation. Goins seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Purchase of Truck for Parks Department – Mathews said he had an opportunity to purchase a 1992 Ford 350 truck for \$8,500.00. He has had the truck looked over and it is in very good condition. Goins made a motion to purchase the truck. Pavey seconded the motion. Motion carried. Bridges said he would like to pay \$6,000.00 on the truck at the first of the week and the remaining \$2,500.00 in July after we receive the June tax draw.

NEW BUSINESS * * *

Heavy Trash Program – Council discussed the possibility of having a City wide heavy trash pick up 3 or 4 times a year until the new program has been implemented and everyone understands how it will work. Byrne made a motion to approve the heavy trash program policy. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried. Council agreed that the trash ordinance would probably need to be addressed after we see how the new trash program works out.

Claims – Pavey made a motion to approve the manual claims and council claims as presented. McGowan seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There being no further business to come before Council, Byrne made a motion to adjourn. Goins seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 7:12 p.m.
