

**MEETING OF THE CITY OF RUSHVILLE, INDIANA
BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY**

SEPTEMBER 3, 2013

5:30 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER: The Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Rushville, Indiana met on the above date and time at 270 West 15th Street, Rushville, Indiana. Mayor Pavey called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

ROLL CALL: Gary Cameron, Angie Barton, and Ron Jarman answered roll call. Board Member, Darrin McGowan was not present. Also present was City Attorney, Julie Newhouse.

MINUTES: Minutes of the August 20, 2013 meeting were presented for approval. Jarman made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Cameron seconded the motion. Motion carried.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Police – Chief Tucker said Zane Faw began his duties today.

Fire – Chief Jenkins said he and Assistant Chief Munson met with our sponsoring hospital and medical director at IU. He said the conversation was good. We will be setting up a time to meet and greet with the guys at the station. We will assess our current program. We will be making some changes to our program since we will be following their protocols. They have offered any assistance that may be needed. They will also be having monthly training session at the station.

Animal – Warden Moran said they will be having an event this Saturday at Family Video from noon until 3:00 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. **Ambulance, Billing Services, Finance Agreement and Graphics** - Mayor Pavey said he asked Chief Jenkins to get 3 quotes on each of these items. The quotes will be opened September 6th and a recommendation will be brought to the Board on September 17.

Mayor Pavey said he would like to know what the top 10 most asked questions have been. He asked the Board to get those questions either to him or Jenkins and they will compile the questions and answers.

2. **Housing Grant Home Repair Approval** – Three applications were presented for approval. Pavey said 14 homes have been approved to date. Six homes have been completed. Two are under construction. Four homes will have signed contracts by September 6th. Two homes will be going out for re-bid as no bids were received. It is anticipated that 20-22 homes will be completed. Cameron made a motion to approve the 3 applicants. Barton seconded the motion. Motion carried.
3. **Little Stars Learning Academy Speeding** – Chief Tucker said he has received complaints about speeding in the area of Little Stars Learning Academy. There has been a request to change the speed limit from 30 to 20 from 9th and Arthur to 11th and Arthur. The Board agreed to make a favorable recommendation to Council in this regard.

ADJOURN: There was no further business to come before the Board; Jarman made a motion to adjourn. Barton seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 5:40 p.m.
