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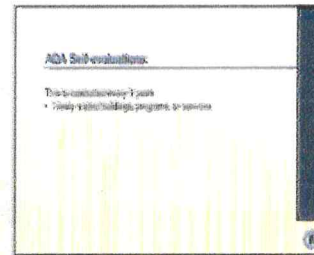
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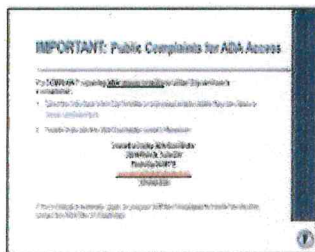
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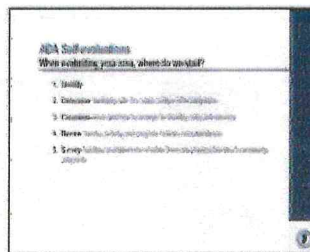
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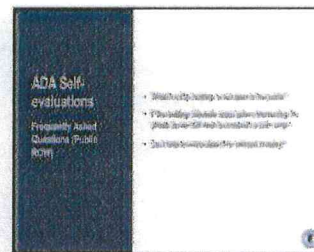
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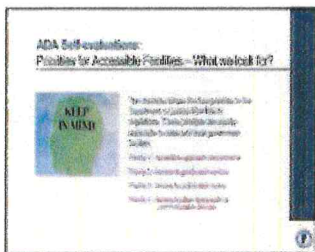
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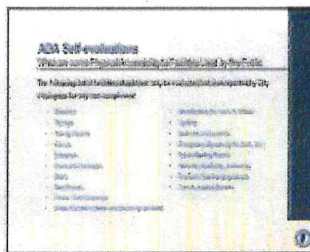
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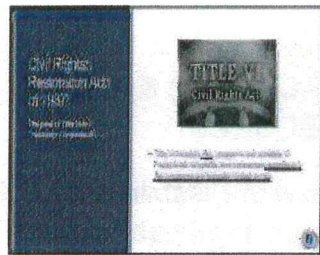
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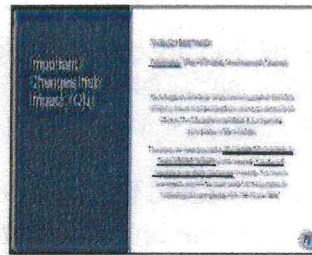
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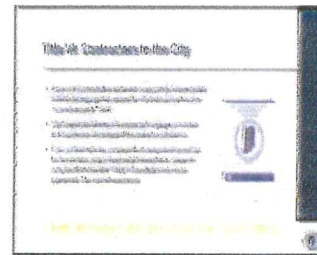
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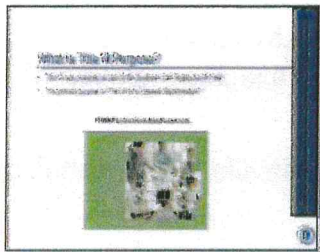
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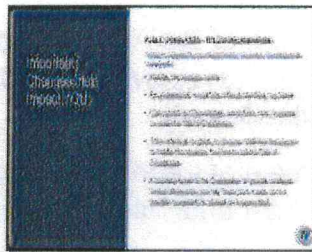
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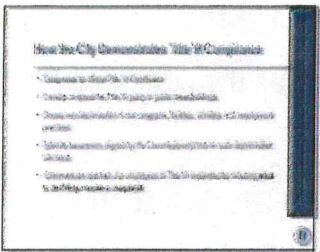
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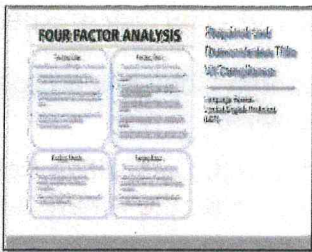
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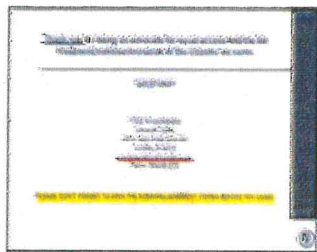
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RESOLUTION 2026-15

A RESOLUTION By the City of Rushville, Indiana APPOINTING THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA) & TITLE VI COORDINATOR AND ADOPTING PROCEDURES

WHEREAS, the Federal government enacted the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) to prevent discrimination of the physically and mentally disabled relating to employment and access to public facilities.

WHEREAS, in compliance with Title II of the ADA, City of Rushville, Indiana shall name an ADA & Title VI Coordinator;

WHEREAS, in compliance with Title II of the ADA, City of Rushville, Indiana shall adopt grievance and complaint procedures for resolving complaints alleging violation of Title II of the ADA; and complaints for Title VI; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with Title II of the ADA, City of Rushville Indiana shall publish notice to the public regarding the ADA and Title VI plan; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with Title II of the ADA, City of Rushville, Indiana shall post the ADA & Title VI coordinator's name, office address, and telephone number along with the ADA & Title VI Notices and grievance procedures on its website.

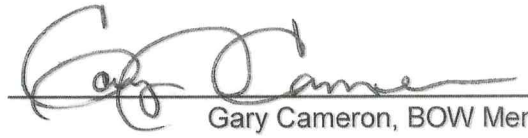
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by City of Rushville, Indiana:

1. PLANNING DIRECTOR, Samantha Copley is designated as the ADA and Title VI Coordinator for City of Rushville.
2. The Notice under the Americans with Disabilities Act, a copy of which is attached hereto, is adopted as the Notice under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
3. The ADA Transition Plan Public Input, a copy of which is attached hereto, is adopted as the Public Input notice to the ADA/Title VI Coordinator.
4. The City of Rushville Grievance Procedure under the ADA, a copy of which is attached hereto, is adopted as the grievance procedure for addressing complaints alleging discrimination based on a disability in the provision of services, activities, programs, or benefits by the government agencies of City of Rushville.
5. The City of Rushville Complaint Procedure under the Title VI Implementation Plan, a copy of which is attached hereto.
6. In compliance with Federal and State laws as set forth above, City of Rushville resolves to post the required information regarding the ADA coordinator, notice under the Americans with Disabilities Act, and City of Rushville Grievance Procedure under the Americans with Disabilities Act on its website and at such other locations as may be determined from time to time.
7. The City of Rushville, hereby, adopts the updated ADA Transition Plan and Title VI Implementation Plan.

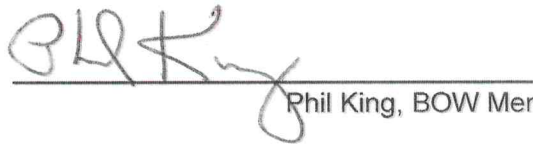

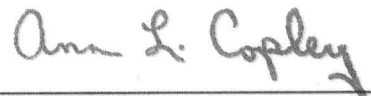

NOTICE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

In accordance with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA") The City of Rushville will not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in its services, programs or activities.

For example, individuals with service animals are welcomed in The City of Rushville offices, where pets are generally prohibited.
